We invite everyone to join us in prayer, worship and outreach as we attempt to continue our mission of ministering in the name of Jesus.



We are a welcoming and vibrant Catholic family of authentic disciples, unified in Jesus Christ, growing, engaging, and serving through uplifting liturgy, faith-based activities, and outreach. We boldly and courageously witness our faith.

History

In June 2, 1967, Father Michael Bednar was appointed founding pastor of the parish of Saints Peter and Paul in West Chester, PA. Before the construction of the church, Mass was celebrated at Immaculata College and Villa Maria House of Studies.

On December 8, 1968, ground breaking for the church took place on a 15-acre tract that was formerly part of the Sullivan Estate.

The first Mass in the newly completed Church took place on Thanksgiving Day, 1969.

The Rectory was built and occupied in September 1981, along with a Parish Center that housed a chapel, meeting rooms, office and library.

Saints Peter and Paul started the new millennium with two major construction projects. In 2001 the Church Narthex was expanded to its present configuration. Saints Peter and Paul School, accommodating pre-K through 8th grade, was built and flourished under Principal Mrs. Margaret Egan.

In 2016, refurbishing and revitializing of the church and grounds took place under the care of pastor Monsignor Angelo Citino.

In 2017, Saints Peter and Paul Parish celebrated fifty years as a community of Faith serving people in the West Chester area.

In 2019, Saints Peter and Paul School was awarded the distinguished honor of being a Blue Ribbon School of Excellence.

In the summer of 2020, Principal Mrs. Margaret Egan retired and Mrs. Veronica Chandler was appointed as the new school principal.

LETTERS OF ELIGIBILITY

Letters of eligibility are necessary for sponsorship for Confirmation or status of Godparents for Baptism. Letters of Eligibility are issued only to registered and participating members of Saints Peter and Paul Parish that meet the following criteria: he or she is at least 16 years of age and has received all of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist) and is able to fulfill the responsibilities involved with being a sponsor. If married, a sponsor must be married in accord with the laws of the Catholic Church.

Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus: First Fridays following the 8:30 AM Mass.

First Friday Holy Hours: Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament 7:00-8:00 PM (September through June) including music, private prayer and Benediction.

MEMORIALS

ANNOUNCED MASSES- These Masses are celebrated in the parish and announced in the weekly bulletin. The usual offering is \$10.00 for daily Mass, \$15 for Vigil and Sunday Mass.

CHURCH MEMORIAL FUND- Monetary donations can be made to the parish in memory of loved ones.



SANCTUARY LAMP INTENTION- The sanctuary lamp will burn for one week for a special intention or in memory of a loved one and is announced in the weekly bulletin. An offering of \$10 is requested.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

BAPTISM- The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the second and fourth Sunday of each month after the 11:30 AM Mass. Parents requesting baptism for their child are required to attend the Baptism Prep class which is held on the first Sunday of each month after the 9:30 AM Mass in the Parish Center. Prior registration is necessary. Please call the Adult Faith Formation Office at 484.473.8205 to sign up.

GODPARENTS/SPONSORS FOR BAPTISM- The role of the Baptismal sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to help the newly baptized lead a Christian life. Therefore, a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic in good standing (married validly), at least 16 years of age and having received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist).

CONFIRMATION- "In the sacrament of Confirmation, the apostles and the bishops, who are their successors, hand on to the baptized the special gift of the Holy Spirit, promised by Christ the Lord and poured upon the Apostles at Pentecost. Thus the initiation in the Christian life is completed." (Rite of Confirmation). Preparation for Confirmation of children is provided through our parish school and our Parish Religious Education program (P.R.E.P.).

HOLY EUCHARIST- "We need to remember that the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life because in the Eucharist is found the entire treasure of the Church: Jesus Christ." (USCCB) "Communion... increases the communicants union with the Lord..." (CCC). Preparation for the reception of Holy communion is provided through the parish school and our PREP program.

Teens and Adults who have not completed their sacraments of initiation are encouraged to contact one of our priests or the Director of Adult Faith Formation at 484.473.8205.



SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

RECONCILIATION- We encourage frequent reception of the Sacrament of God's love, available anytime by appointment or the schedule printed on previous page.

CARE OF THE SICK- Please notify the Parish Office when any family members are ill and cannot come to church regularly. The priests want to be able to bring Holy Communion and minister the Anointing of the Sick. If you know you are entering the hospital, please notify the parish priest in advance so that he can administer the Sacrament of the Sick before you enter the hospital.

HOMEBOUND PARISHIONERS- Please notify us when a parishioner is homebound. This will allow us to pray for them and visit them. Holy Communion is brought to them monthly by our priests and if desired, weekly by an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. Call the Parish Office to arrange for visits.



HOSPITAL VISITS- If you or a family member enters the hospital unexpectedly, or while in the hospital need a priest in an emergency situation, please ask the nurses or hospital personnel to contact the chaplain on call. The parish priests are happy to make hospital visits when able. Every hospital has a priest on call for emergencies.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

MATRIMONY- Couples wishing to be married here at Saints Peter and Paul Parish must contact the Parish Office at their earliest convenience, but no less than six months before the wedding. Archdiocesan policy requires all couples preparing for marriage to attend the Pre-Cana program. Information on the Pre-Cana program can be obtained at the Parish Center.

RELIGIOUS VOCATIONS- Anyone who is discerning to be a priest, sister or brother is encouraged to call the Parish Center to discuss the matter with the parish priest.

NEXT GENERATION PARISH

Starting in September 2021, a team of ten Saints Peter And Paul parishioners worked with Msgr. Citino to draft a Three-year strategic plan. With the assistance of the Catholic Leadership Institute (CLI), this "Envisioning Team" assessed the strengths and opportunities of the parish Using the Disciple Maker Index survey from 2018, sacramental data, a review of parish ministries, as well as the lived experiences of the team members.

With this information in hand, the Envisioning Team started with the Parish mission and vision statements developed in 2019. The slightly revised parish vision statement is:

We are a welcoming and vibrant Catholic family of authentic disciples, unified in Jesus Christ, growing, engaging, and serving through uplifting liturgy faith-based activities, and outreach. We boldly and courageously witness our faith.

They also drafted three key parish values (Faith, Generosity and Community) and four parish priorities:

- Develop personal and communal holiness
- Celebrate uplifting and meaningful liturgies
- Foster relationships to develop a community of authentic disciples
- Increase personal outreach experiences



Creating communities of disciples, leaders, and missionaries for today and tomorrow.

LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

The most important thing we do each week is celebrate Mass together. This is the place where we receive the strength to act courageously as Christians in the world. It is a time of encouragement and challenge. The Mass is for everyone and everyone has an important role to play.

ADULT ALTAR SERVER

Adults are trained for the ministry of altar server. They fulfill this ministry by serving at daily Mass, benediction and other special liturgical events.

ADULT FUNERAL SERVERS

We are a small group of adults who assist the priest at funerals. We welcome all adults young and old, male and female, who would be available late mornings for a couple of hours during the month. Funerals are assigned on a volunteer basis so you do not need to be available every week. No problem if you go South for the winter or to the shore for the summer! No prior altar serving experience necessary. We find it very gratifying to be a small part of the celebration of a person entering eternal life with God.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

Extraordinary Ministers distribute Holy Communion at Mass. Some of them also give of themselves by bringing the Eucharist to the homebound of the parish and our local nursing home residents. Extraordinary Ministers are appointed by our pastor and serve for three years.

GREETERS

Our purpose is to joyfully, enthusiastically and sincerely welcome each person coming to Mass. Volunteers for this ministry are assigned to greet in accordance with their schedules and availability. As a Greeter, you may think that you are signing up to open doors, but really you are making an eternal impact for the Kingdom of God. You are helping to create an environment where lives can change through the love of Christ!

LECTORS

Lectors proclaim the Word of God at the liturgical celebrations of the parish, especially the Sunday Liturgy. They play an important part in the life of the Church by helping to proclaim the Word of God to the people in a way that allows God's Word to penetrate their minds and hearts. Those wanting to be lectors must be practicing Catholics who are in good standing with the Church. Training is provided.

LITURGICAL MUSIC MINISTRY

Saints Peter and Paul has a vibrant and welcoming music ministry which supports the parish's congregational worship during sacred liturgies. We strive to enhance the liturgy by using our time and talents to prepare music that turns all minds and hearts to God. As leaders of music, we encourage the congregation to respond and participate during Masses and special liturgies, which includes 40 Hours Devotion, Holy Days, First Communion, Confirmation, Parish May Procession, etc. For more information regarding our choirs and music ministry, please email our liturgical music director, Anna Marie Snader, amsnader@sspeterandpaulrc.org or call 610.692.2216, ext. 265.

USHERS

Our ushers are also "ambassadors of hospitality" as they help welcome those who come together to worship. In addition to gathering the parishioners' offerings, ushers seat people, care for the needs of the assembly, help with good order at time of Communion and when the congregation has to move, and distribute bulletins at the end of Mass. Eligibility is open to all adult parishioners.

SPIRITUAL ENRICHMENT

We want to provide as many opportunities as possible for all our members to grow in their faith. You can help by offering to share your own skills with others and by participating when opportunities for improving your understanding of the faith are provided.

BIBLE STUDY

Our mission is to come to know God through the study of His Word. Our goal for each study we undertake is to become more spiritually mature. We seek to be transformed. Our small group format allows us to discuss how we can apply these truths to our lives and be better equipped to serve the Body of Christ.

We find that our understanding is refined through group discussions and the weekly videos. We are growing in the certainty of God's love for us as part of mankind.

We have been using Ascension Press Bible studies since 2009. We usually complete one study in the Fall and one in the Spring. Each study is generally 8-10 weeks in length. We offer two classes that meet once a week: Tuesdays at 7:00 PM and Thursdays at 10:00 AM in the Parish Center.

CHRISTLIFE

The ChristLife program equips Catholics for evangelization so that all people might personally encounter Jesus Christ and be transformed into His missionary disciples. ChristLife consists of three series, starting with Discovering Christ, a journey that invites people into a personal relationship with Jesus. Next is Following Christ, which explores what means Catholic it to be а Lastly, Sharing Christ witnesses how to share the good news of lesus Christ with others. THE DIVINE MERCY CENACLE

This is an opportunity for people to gather and become more familiar with the precepts of Jesus as Divine Mercy. The group studies The Diary of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska which includes her personal conversations with Jesus. These small groups study the writings with the help of Cenacle Formation Manuals, Holy Scripture and the Catechism of the CatholicChurch. Following discussion the group then prays for personal and parish intentions and recites the Divine Mercy Chaplet. The goal of each member is to become a Eucharistic Apostle of Divine Mercy and their mission is to build up the local parish through works of mercy and promoting Eucharistic devotion. The group meets every other Tuesday at 7:00 PM (there are currently 3 groups) at the Parish Center. PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

Parish Religious Education Program also known as PREP offers a variety of ways to help our families build their relationship with the Lord. For our little ones, we are working on bringing back our Little Liturgy and Kid's Club once or twice a month during the school year. This is a great way for parents to meet other parents and kids to meet other kids in the parish. Other guardians are welcome too!

Vacation Bible School is a 4-day summer camp where our children learn more about the Lord, typically offered the week when or after school ends.

PREP, also known as CCD is our Religious Education Program for our students in grades 1 through 7. Our students learn about our faith on a weekly basis throughout the school year. Children need to be in PREP continuously so they are prepared to receive their Sacraments.

All Ability PREP- In addition to PREP, we invite our all ability students and their parents to meet with us once a month during the school year. Our lessons include fun, hands-on activities as well as teachings from the Bible in a relaxed casual environment. Our hope is to grow our special needs ministry and help promote inclusion of all our children and families with additional needs. We also work with all of our children to receive their Sacraments so if you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask and please spread the word to other families in our community. We want everyone to have a support system and know that God and our parish love all of God's children. Many of our children attend PREP and our all ability PREP.

CIT

CIT stands for Catechist in Training. This program is for students in 8th grade and up to assist in our PREP program. (We understand if they cannot help every week).

Family Events For our families, we have events like Trunk or Treat, and Easter Egg Hunt. In conjunction with our Family Ministry Committee, there is a monthly Children's Mass combined with our parish Donut Sunday from September through May.

Family Ministry Committee-oversees parish events such as the Children's Mass, Children's Liturgy of the Word, parish playdates, etc. We hope to grow our committee and its offerings, but we need your help to do so!

Youth Group meets after school once a month on Thursdays.

Our Pre-Kindergarten, within an elementary school offers an age-appropriate academic environment in a nurturing and structured setting.

Flexible scheduling options are available including half days, 3-days, 4-days and 5-days.

Full time students are given preference for enrollment. Hours for the full day program are 8:15 AM to 2:30 PM. Hours for the half day option is 8:15 AM to 11:30 AM.

Children learn to function appropriately in a classroom setting by interacting with others, sharing, playing cooperatively, asking for help, making good choices and using their words.

Enrichment includes music, library and physical education.

The goal of the Pre K4 program is Kindergarten readiness. Children learn to transition as they move throughout the school to assemblies, music class, the library, and to the gym for physical education. Children experience other adults (teachers) in these classes.

Kindergarten students are fully-integrated into the school and follow the schedule of the day. Students eat in the cafeteria using the Aramark lunch program and utilize the school fields and playgrounds for recess.

All classes partake in school field trips.

Priority registration is given to current families registering younger siblings. Open registration begins at the end of January and the beginning of February.

Free babysitting is usually provided in the art room by 8th grade students. It is a great opportunity to mingle with other school parents and learn what is going on at the school.
